- B. Married or Single Is One More Spiritual?
 - 1. Theme: The key to true spirituality is not either marriage or being single, but rather determining God's call and gifts for us, and following biblical mandates for our lives.
 - 2. Text: 1 Corinthians 7:1-9
 - 3. Reading: 1 Timothy 4:1-5

II. Wise Courtship: Biblical Principles For Selecting A Marriage Partner

- A. Biblical Principles for Selecting A Marriage Partner (Part 1)
 - Theme: Although the bible does not give a specific plan for dating or courtship, it does give key principles, the most important of which is that they must be a believer.
 - 2. Text: 1 Corinthians 7:39

- B. Biblical Principles for Selecting A Marriage Partner (Part 2)
 - 1. Theme: When thinking about a marriage partner, we need to follow God's wisdom and choose someone, not based on external looks, but on the basis of godly character.
 - 2. Text: Proverbs 31:10, 31
 - 3. Reading: 1 Corinthians 1:18-25
- C. Biblical Principles for Selecting A Marriage Partner (Part 3)
 - 1. Theme: When building a relationship with a marriage partner, the Scripture calls for absolute sexual purity in action and desire.
 - 2. Text: 1 Thessalonians 4:1-8
 - 3. Reading: Psalm 33:1-5

III. Marriage Issues in the New Millennium

- A. Is Cohabitation the Same As Marriage?
 - 1. Theme: Cohabitation is different in both purpose and practice from marriage, does not fit the biblical parameters for marriage and thus does not benefit the individuals or society..
 - 2. Text: Genesis 2:22-24; Matthew 19:3-6
 - 3. Reading: Psalm 63:1-5
- B. Does God Allow Homosexual Marriage?
 - Theme: Although Christians must show compassion to those trapped in homosexuality, we must be clear that it is a sin, and that God would never condone homosexual marriage.

- A. The Covenant Nature of Marriage
 - 1. Theme: Marriage is a life-long covenant between a man and a woman to be exclusively faithful to one another.

- B. The Purposes of Marriage
 - 1. Theme: Marriage must be centered on God, and its true purposes are found in fulfilling our call to display God's image in all the earth.
 - 2. Text: Genesis 1:26-28; 2:18-24

- C. Roles and Responsibilities in the Home
 - Theme: To fulfill God's purposes for marriage and have a strong family, we must follow His blueprint for the roles for each person in the family.

 - Theme: God desires that we raise children according to His Word so that they will love and follow Him.

1. Theme: Divorce is a tragedy arising from man's sin which produces devastating effects on all involved, so Christians should always work to save marriages.

1. Theme: God may allow remarriage, but the sinful conduct which destroyed the previous marriage must be rectified first through repentance and proper actions.
